

EIL plays pivotal role in Dabhol LNG Terminal

In a major milestone for India's energy infrastructure, Engineers India Limited (EIL), serving as project management consultant (PMC), has played a pivotal role in the successful berthing and discharge of GAIL's LNG vessel at the Dabhol LNG Terminal on June 2, 2025. This marks the commissioning of a state-of-the-art



breakwater facility for GAIL (India) Limited and executed by Larsen & Toubro (L&T). This 2.3 km-long island rubble mound breakwater, constructed using over 15,500 indigenously developed Accropode blocks and placed with 3D Echoscope technology for precision and integrity, enables year-round operations at the terminal. Despite a limited construction window of just 5-6 months, the project was delivered with world-class engineering finesse. EIL's role as PMC was instrumental in coordinating the complex engineering, environmental clearances and execution phases, ensuring seamless delivery of this critical infrastructure.
