



GAIL Gas Ltd exploring possibility of tapping into the stock market

NEW DELHI: GAIL Gas Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of GAIL (India) Ltd handling its City Gas Distribution (CGD) business, is exploring a potential stock market listing to fund future growth.

As a first step, the company has invited bids to appoint a consultant for a feasibility study. "GGL is exploring the possibility of listing in Indian Stock Exchange for which it intends to hire a consultant to study various aspects related to listing of GGL," the tender document states. Issued on August 28, 2025, the tender closes on September 23, 2025.

GAIL Gas is currently implementing CGD projects in 16 Geographical Areas (GAs)

across eight states, including Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, Uttarakhand, Odisha, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh. Its 2024-25 Annual Report highlights supply of PNG to over two lakh households and 1,600 industrial and commercial users, alongside more than 500 CNG stations. Through JVs, the company is also expanding in Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Uttarakhand, Goa and Assam.

GAIL Gas reported record operational revenue of Rs 12,231 crore in FY25, with PAT at Rs 451 crore, reflecting a 40 per cent rise over the previous year. The company is also evaluating acquisition of six GAs from GAIL, spanning Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha and UP.

The consultant will assess the company's valuation, market conditions, investor sentiment, regulatory compliance, corporate governance, risk factors and recommend a shareholding structure.

India's natural gas demand may rise 8 per cent annually to 297 MMSCMD by 2030, with CGD contributing 29 per cent that year and 44 per cent by 2040.

Cabinet decides to allot land to GAIL for bio-CNG unit

The Karnataka Cabinet has cleared key proposals, including allotment of land to GAIL (India) Limited to set up a bio-CNG plant.

"The cabinet has approved allotment of 18 acres of land at Haralakunte village, Begur Hobli, Bengaluru South Taluk to GAIL India on a 'Permissive Use' basis for 25 years to establish a 300 metric tonne per day bio-CNG unit, expandable up to 500 metric tonnes per day," the Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister H K Patil said on Thursday while briefing reporters about the cabinet decision.

He added that the Revenue Department and Bengaluru Solid Waste Management Limited would jointly survey the land and hand it over with proper maps, while the Urban Development Department's Additional Chief Secretary has been authorised to resolve



any operational or implementation issues that may arise.

The cabinet has also approved issuing guidelines to curb the sale of spurious chemicals in the name of bio-diesel.

Patil said, "Bio-diesel produced from used cooking oil is currently being supplied only for personal and hotel use and is not available in the open market. Since blended diesel cannot be sold in retail outlets, the government will frame clear guidelines to prevent the sale of other chemicals under the name

of bio-diesel."

He said the cabinet has decided to approve the draft notification of "The Bio-Diesel (B-100) Blending with High Speed Diesel for Transportation Purposes (Licensing) Order, 2022".

The cabinet also decided to extend Ayushman Bharat Arogya Karnataka scheme benefits to all senior citizens aged 70 years and above, including ESIS beneficiaries.

"This extension has been done as per the Government of India's Vayo Vandana Yojana guidelines and with its approval," he stated.
