GAIL, & Japan's Mitsui O.S.K. Lines Ltd (MOL) signed a long-term charter for the LNG carrier "GAIL BHUWAN" on Jan. 27, 2026, during India Energy Week in Goa. Signed by GAIL ED, S Bairagi & MOL's Hisashi Umemura, it involves their JV LNG Japonica Shipping in the presence of GAIL's CMD. Building on their partnership, it leverages MOL's safety record, aligns with Maritime Amrit Kaal Vision 2047, and supports net-zero goals. GAIL's 18,000+ km pipelines and largest Indian LNG fleet ensure supply security. Besides, MOL identifies Asia as a region expected to deliver strong economic growth.

जापानी कंपनी के लाइन और जेएम बक्सी समूह के साथ सिंगापुर स्थित शिप-ओनिंग कंपनी में इकिवटी भागीदारी के लिए समझौते पर हस्ताक्षर किए हैं। यह समझौता केंद्रीय पेट्रोलियम एवं प्राकृतिक गैस मंत्री हरदीप सिंह पुरी की उपस्थिति में हुआ। गेल के सीएमडी संदीप कुमार गुप्ता ने बताया कि शिपिंग कंपनी में हिस्सेदारी लेना एक रणनीतिक फैसला है, जिससे गेल के पास अब दो एलएनजी जहाजों का स्वामित्व होगा। यह निवेश गेल की सहायक कंपनी गेल ग्लोबल आईएफएससी लिमिटेड के माध्यम से किया जाएगा। दक्षिण कोरिया में बन रहा यह नया एलएनजी जहाज 2027 से परिचालन शुरू करेगा।

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GAIL sees FY27 capex at ₹100 bn

GAIL (India) Ltd. expects to spend INR 90 billion-INR 100 billion in capital expenditure in 2026-27 (Apr-Mar), the company's management told analysts in a conference call on Monday.

The company, which spent nearly INR 22 billion in capex in the December quarter, sees its capex for FY26 at around INR 107 billion. The FY27 capex does not include any costs the company may incur in setting up new projects. The management said there is no substantial rise in capex plans for FY27 as most of the company's projects are on the verge of completion. "Large part of capex will be on pipeline in FY27 and even in 28. And then we have net zero plan of 35,000 crore (INR 350 billion) over 10 years," the management said. It listed likely investments of INR 20 billion-INR 30 billion on adding 700 megawatts of renewable energy projects, and INR 8 billion-INR 10 billion on compressed bio-gas and liquefied natural gas.

GAIL (India) posted a fall of nearly 59% on year in net profit for the December quarter at INR 16.03 billion, as its revenue from operations declined 2.5% on year to INR 340.76 billion. GAIL is also working on setting up 29 liquefied natural gas retail outlets, for which work on five locations is already underway.

BPCL Bets Big on Petrochem; ONGC, IOC Cut Back a Bit

New Delhi: State-run refiner Bharat Petroleum (BPCL) has raised its capital expenditure plan for the coming fiscal year by 35% to ₹25,000 crore, driven by an aggressive push into petrochemicals, even as peers Indian Oil and ONGC have trimmed their investment budgets.

Indian Oil, the country's largest refiner, plans to spend ₹32,700 crore on capex, while top oil and gas producer ONGC has set aside ₹30,000 crore—both about 6% lower than their FY26 spending, according to the budget document. Capex at GAIL, the nation's largest gas marketer and transporter, is slated to rise 29% to ₹11,518 crore, while declining at Hindustan Petroleum (HPCL) and Oil India.

Overall, state-run oil companies plan to spend ₹1.34 trillion in FY27, marginally higher than ₹1.30 trillion this year. Of the total, ₹60,000 crore has been earmarked for refining and marketing, a 6% decline, while spending on exploration and production is set to rise 4% to ₹57,600 crore.

The sharpest increase is in the petrochemicals segment, where spending will jump 56% next year to ₹16,000 crore next year.

BPCL will account for the largest share of this outlay, nearly tripling its petrochemicals investment to ₹9,750 crore from ₹3,500 crore this year. Indian Oil has allocated ₹3,875 crore for petrochemicals, while GAIL has earmarked ₹2,256 crore.

HPCL's overall planned capex for next fiscal will fall 16% to ₹9,641 crore as its Rajasthan refinery—one of its biggest spending projects in recent years—nears commissioning. Oil India's capex will edge down 2% to ₹8,653 crore.

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गेल ने 5,706 करोड़ रुपये राजस्व बताया

नई दिल्ली। गेल (इंडिया) लिमिटेड ने बीते नौ महीनों के लिए ऑपरेशन से 1,03,899 करोड़ रुपये का राजस्व बताया। नौ महीनों के लिए टैक्स से पहले लाभ पिछले साल की के 12,123 करोड़ के मुकाबले 7,387 करोड़ रहा और टैक्स के बाद लाभ पिछले साल के 9,263 करोड़ के मुकाबले 5,706 करोड़ रहा।
