GAIL (India) Ltd reported revenue from operations of Rs 1,03,899 crore for nine months ended December 31, 2025 as compared to Rs 1,01,580 crore in corresponding period of the financial year 2024-25. Profit Before Tax (PBT) for nine months stood at Rs 7,387 crore as compared to Rs 12,123 crore for the corresponding period in the previous year and PAT stood at Rs 5,706 crore as compared to Rs 9,263 crore in the corresponding period of previous year.
